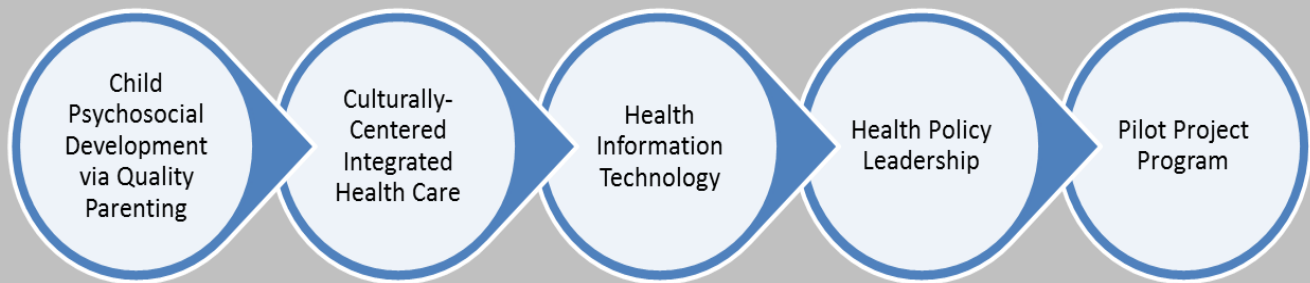


ABOUT TCC AND THE HEALTH POLICY TO PRACTICE FORUM
